Property Update – becoming Trinity Catholic College 2025

We're pleased to provide an update on the capital works and physical building upgrades to support a fully integrated Year 7 to 12 school.

As we transition to Trinity Catholic College we are working with the Diocesan Property Services team to provide specific areas for our Year 11 and 12 students, as well as enhancements for our whole school facilities that will benefit all students and support the best possible learning environments.

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What's happening?

The broader Trinity Catholic College Masterplan

Over the coming years construction works and enhancements will take place at our school.

These works will be conducted in stages to ensure the continuity of learning and spaces are suitable. The upgrades will include the demolition of some of our existing buildings to allow for new ones, and the master planning ensures connection and landscaping zones to enhance the flow of our school site.

The masterplan is subject to further design development and changes. It is anticipated to include:

- New basketball playing space to the west side of existing playground.
- New multistorey building housing VET Construction, Woodwork, Metalwork, Art and STEM workshops, with associated storage and support spaces. It is planned that this will be constructed on the existing hardstand play space.
- General purpose learning areas associated with TAS, STEM and Science.
- Access roads and delivery bays associated with TAS faculty.
- New multistorey building housing GLA spaces, learning hub and Exam Centre.
- New multistorey building housing Administration, Food technology, canteen and staff areas.
- Student amenities and breakout spaces.
- New school entry and associated carparking off Fletcher Street.
- New single-storey, double height building housing Communal Hall, internal sports court, changerooms, gym and PE teaching spaces.
- External covered structure to external hardcourts.
- Landscape zones and connection to buildings, including The Factory wing.

We look forward to sharing more about the masterplan and new facilities in the future.

A new Flexible Learning Village

For the use of our senior students, a flexible learning village will be established onsite, to the immediate north of the existing St Anne's Courtyard and the Sister Marie Centre.

This will provide a specialised VET Construction workshop, a senior science laboratory, as well as five new general learning spaces with operable walls to allow for a large exam centre space.

The new area will also provide a covered walkway and outdoor work area, as well as storage and service areas.

The work will also ensure the relocation of existing demountables onsite to ensure clear vision and connection of the new area to the existing St Anne's Courtyard space.

A senior lounge and study space

Work will be undertaken to refurbish Block E and its existing general learning areas that are surplus to the school needs. This will create a new senior lounge and study space with kitchen facilities for student use.

The refurbishment will also include covered awning protection to the west, window replacement and new service supply with air-conditioning and lighting.

Further improvements to the general learning areas within Block E will provide new technological requirements, natural ventilation, and daylight. A senior Art Project Store within the existing art faculty in Block E will also be included.



Senior Lounge and Study Space

Timings

Both the Flexible Learning Village and Senior Lounge and Study Space are anticipated to be completed by the commencement of the school year in 2025. Of course, building work timeframes are subject to change due to weather and construction impacts.
