

SCHOOL UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS



UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to be neat, follow personal hygiene measures and to be dressed in an appropriate way for the activity in which they are engaged.
- Parental permission should be provided to the Leader of Wellbeing, as a written note or email, if the correct uniform is unable to be worn. This permission is valid only as a short-term measure on a case-by-case basis. Parents and carers agree to the Catholic Schools Office Uniform Policy upon student enrolment.
- Out-of-uniform/mufti days require students to wear appropriate casual clothing. Shorts, dresses and skirts must be an appropriate length. No midriff tops or garments displaying inappropriate or offensive messages are permitted. T-shirts, tops and dresses must have sleeves that cover the shoulders. Where possible, sun hats protecting the face, ears and neck are to be worn. Footwear must protect the whole foot. Slip-on shoes and rubber thongs are not permitted.
- Swimwear at carnivals and other events must be appropriate. Speedo style swimwear with full briefs or board shorts are to be worn. Costumes must NOT be transparent. The wearing of a rash shirt during water sports is also strongly encouraged.
- The Sport Uniform for Seniors is required if participating in optional Friday afternoon sport, or timetabled activities for practical sport courses. The Senior Everyday Uniform must be worn at all other times.
- If a student's personal presentation is likely to pose a risk to their safety, or that of anyone else participating in the school activity, the Principal can exclude them from participating in that activity. For example; footwear, headwear, the length of hair, hairstyle, jewellery, fingernails. This action can be taken if the student does not remove the item, even if they are otherwise complying with the college uniform expectations. Matters of cultural sensitivity will be determined on an individual basis at the discretion of the Principal.



UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

Hair

- Hair is to be of a natural colour, tidy and clean.
- Long hair must be tied back from the face for practical lessons.
- Neat facial hair is permitted in Stage 6 or for religious/cultural considerations.

Make-up

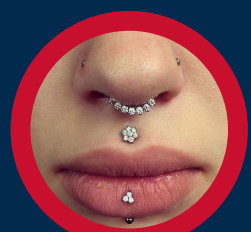
- No excessive make-up is to be worn. A 'natural' look is to be aimed for.
- False lashes and false fingernails are not to be worn.
- Nails should be clean and kept short. Nail polish is not permitted.

Jewellery

- Jewellery is to be kept to a minimum.
- Students are permitted up to three earrings in each ear.
- No large hoops or dangling earrings, facial piercings or septum piercings are permitted. This includes the nose, lip, eyebrows, tongue or any other part of the face.
- Necklaces must be no wider than 7mm and pendants no bigger than 25 mm in diameter.
- Students are permitted up to two rings and one bracelet on each hand.

Tattoos

- If a student has a tattoo, it is not to be visible at any time.





UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

Sun Safety

- Students are strongly encouraged to wear the school hat and use sunscreen for outside activities.
- Sunscreen for reapplication is available from the PE staffroom and Student Services.

Footwear

- Sports joggers need to be supportive of the foot. They cannot be flat-soled skate-style such as Converse or Vans.
- Seniors must wear fully covered black leather lace-up shoes with their Everyday Uniform. They cannot be flat-soled skate-type shoes, such as Converse or Vans, or Mary Jane style shoes such as Dr. Martens, even if they are leather. Shoes must not extend over the ankle or have a platform.
- All students must wear fully enclosed leather shoes for practical lessons in Science and Technology.
- Examples of shoes not permitted include boots (except those used in Construction/Technology lessons), ballet-type shoes, suede or canvas shoes, shoes with a strap that only covers the front of the foot.
- Note: vegan leather is also permissible.

Trinity Catholic College New Uniform FAQs

When are students expected to start wearing the Trinity Catholic College uniform?

In 2025, it is compulsory for all students in Years 7 and 11, and any new students to the College, to wear the new Trinity uniform.

Are current students able to purchase the new Trinity uniform for 2025?

Yes, most definitely. Ideally, we would prefer all students to wear the Trinity uniform from 2025; however, in line with the CSO School Uniform Policy, the new uniform has a phase-in period of three years to address any financial concerns.

Will St Pius X uniforms still be available for purchase from the Uniform Shop?

No. The Alinta Uniform Shop will only stock brand-new Trinity uniforms from 2025.

Can students mix and match the St Pius X and Trinity uniforms?

No. Students must wear one uniform or the other.

Why don't the Junior students have a formal uniform?

Our extensive uniform consultations with parents, students and teachers found that most did not want two separate uniforms for Junior students. The Everyday Uniform range supports the practical nature of our student activities.

What uniform will Junior students wear if they are participating in formal occasions or representative events?

There will be a range of Trinity Senior uniforms available for Junior students to wear at selected formal representative events if necessary.

Do all students have to wear the bucket hat?

All students are strongly encouraged to wear a hat when outdoors. Only the Trinity bucket hat is to be worn with the Trinity uniform, or the St Pius cap with the St Pius X uniform.

Are Alinta socks compulsory for all students wearing the Trinity uniform?

Yes, students must always wear Alinta socks. Juniors are required to wear white Alinta sports socks with their Everyday Uniform. Seniors must wear navy Alinta socks with their Everyday Uniform, and white Alinta socks when wearing the Sport Uniform.

Will all Seniors need to purchase the Sport Uniform?

No. The Sport Uniform is not compulsory for Seniors. It is required if participating in optional Friday sport, or timetabled practical classes for Health & Movement Science or Sport, Lifestyle and Recreation. The Sport Uniform cannot be worn by Seniors at any other time.

Can the cotton jumper be worn by all students?

Yes, the cotton jumper can be worn by all Juniors and Seniors at any time of the year. It is an optional item to help students stay warm during the colder days. For Seniors, the cotton jumper may be worn underneath the blazer as required.

When do Seniors have to wear the blazer and tie?

In Terms 2&3, Seniors must wear the blazer and tie at school, to and from school, and for any representative occasions. The blazer can also be worn in Terms 1&4 if needed.

Are trousers compulsory for Senior boys during winter?

Yes. The trousers (with blazer and tie) must be worn by boys during Terms 2&3 and during any other formal school events. Shorts cannot be worn as part of the Everyday Uniform during Terms 2&3.

Do Senior girls have to wear the skirt?

No. In Terms 2&3 they can choose to wear the skirt with black opaque tights, or the pants. During Terms 1&4, girls also have the option of wearing the Everyday Uniform shorts or pants.

Is it compulsory for Senior girls to wear black tights in Winter?

During Terms 2&3, if girls are wearing the skirt, they must also wear black opaque tights (at least 70 denier). During Terms 1&4, girls must wear the Alinta navy socks with their skirt.

Should students attend a uniform fitting with Alinta?

Yes. All students purchasing the new uniform must attend a uniform fitting as the sizes and styles are not consistent with the St Pius X uniform range.

What shoes are worn with the Trinity uniform?

Seniors must wear fully covered black leather lace-up shoes with their everyday uniform. They cannot be flat-soled skate-type shoes, such as Vans or Converse, or Mary Jane style shoes such as Dr. Martens, or high-top boots, even if they are leather.

Junior students must wear sports joggers with their Everyday Uniform. Wearing leather shoes is a compulsory WHS requirement for Technology and Science practical lessons, therefore, it is strongly encouraged that sports joggers are leather to avoid having to carry a second pair of shoes to school. Senior students must also wear joggers with their sports uniform. All shoes must be supportive, lace-up, and completely cover the foot.
